Introduction

Our exploration of two of North America's most scenic landscapes begins in the exciting "Wild West" town of Jackson, in the shadow of the Grand Tetons. Rising 6000 feet above the plains of Wyoming, this rugged, snow-capped range of peaks is one of the most impressive parts of the entire Rocky Mountains. We start with a 5-day backpacking trek into the west side of Teton Range, an area which sees very few visitors (especially when compared to the well-used, designated campsites on the east side of the range). Here, we begin hiking through a beautiful canyon with lush vegetation and cascading mountain streams. We soon leave the main trail and ascend a seldom-used route to a secluded and unnamed lake, nestled in a breathtaking alpine valley. From here, we traverse to the spine of the Teton Range with spectacular views of the Grand Teton (4197m. - 13,770ft.) and the surrounding peaks of the Cathedral Group. Ascending off trail, we cross over a 2800 metre-high pass and into a hanging valley containing a series of small lakes beneath glacier carved granite cirques. One of the options that we have in this area is to climb a nearby, straightforward 3300 metre-high peak. After a night back in Jackson, we make the short transfer to Yellowstone National Park and have the afternoon to explore and enjoy the spectacular Old Faithful Geyser Basin, before checking in for a night at the atmospheric Old Faithful Lodge. Yellowstone was the world's first national park and is noted for its geothermal activity. There are more than 10,000 hot springs and geysers, which issue from one of the world's largest active volcanoes, which last erupted some 650,000 years ago, creating a crater which spans almost half of the park. More than this, however, Yellowstone is an outstanding mountain wilderness, home to elk, bison, wolf and grizzly bear. We will have the chance to experience all of this diversity, as we undertake a 4-day, 55 kilometre (34 miles) backpacking trip into the south-west corner of the park. The scenic trail takes us through pristine backcountry geyser basins, past towering waterfalls, placid rivers and riverside hot springs. Combining two great wilderness areas, this is the very best of Wyoming.

Itinerary

Group Size and Trip Status

For each of our group holidays, there is a minimum number of participants required to enable the trip to go ahead. The pricing panel on the front page of this dossier gives an indication of group size, showing minimum and maximum numbers. Once the minimum number is reached, the trip status will change from 'Available' to 'Guaranteed to Run'. You can check the trip status by accessing our website at www.keadventure.com or by calling the KE office. Other than in exceptional circumstances, we will not cancel a trip once it has achieved this guaranteed to run status and so you are free to proceed with your international flight booking and other travel arrangements. If you are unsure about the trip status, please call our office.

Day 1. Depart UK

Depart from London Heathrow in the early afternoon and arrive at Salt Lake City in the evening. We check in to a hotel at the airport, making use of the hotel's free shuttle-bus service from the terminal.

Day 2. Drive from Salt Lake City to Jackson

After a leisurely breakfast, today starts out with a 5-hour transfer to Jackson, a town that prides itself on being the last of the Old West. The transfer departs from the airport at Salt Lake City shortly after midday and it will be necessary to arrange that the hotel shuttle bus returns us to the airport in good time to catch the Jackson Hole Express which arrives in Jackson in the evening, taking us directly to our hotel. Jackson grew up on the edge of a level, sage-brush covered outwash plain and it is this valley which is (more accurately) known as Jackson Hole. The town of Jackson sits in a high Wyoming valley surrounded by the majestic Teton Range to the west and the Gros Ventre wilderness to the east. We will meet our guide at the hotel and have a short briefing over dinner.

Day 3. Trekking along Teton Creek

After breakfast we drive for an hour to the trailhead at Teton Canyon on the west side of the Teton Range. From here, we set off hiking amongst soaring limestone cliffs and stands of lodgepole pine, following the cascading Teton Creek. We arrive at our awesome campsite near a secluded nameless lake tucked beneath glacier-carved granite buttresses.

Day 4. Ascent of Table Mountain

This is a stunning lakeside camping place and we will stay here for another night, making it our basecamp for today's walk. This means, of course, that we can leave most of our equipment in the camp and set off lightly laden for the summit of Table Mountain (3386m. - 11,110ft.) a splendid peak which provides views of Grand Teton and surrounding peaks. They seem almost close enough to touch. We return to camp for the evening.

Day 5. South Leigh Pass and Lakes

In the morning, we break camp and hike on a rarely-used trail which takes us across South Leigh Pass, offering spectacular views of the entire Grand Teton Range. We then descend towards South Leigh Lakes, an area which is studded with stunning alpine lakes, with a backdrop of rugged granite cliffs. We'll spend

the next two nights here among some of the most beautiful mountain scenery anywhere in the world.

Day 6. Ascent of Leigh Peak

Again we leave our backpacks behind, this time for a day hike to the summit of Leigh Peak (3255m. - 10,680 ft.) and its unsurpassed views of the northern portion of the Teton Range. Return to camp at South Leigh Lakes.

Day 7. Return to Jackson

Moving on from our picturesque basecamp, we pass several small lakes and gain the ridge dividing South Leigh Canyon from Teton Canyon. Here, looking back, there is an amazing panoramic view of the pristine area where we have spent the last four days. From the ridge, we make our way back to the trailhead at the mouth of Teton Canyon and meet our transport for the drive back to Jackson. Overnight in the group's hotel.

Day 8 Drive to Yellowstone National Park

It's time to move on and today we make the short transfer to the Old Faithful area of Yellowstone National Park. We'll have the day to leisurely explore the Upper Geyser Basin, which contains many of the park's most famous and most spectacular geysers and hot springs, including venerable Old Faithful Geyser. We spend the night in the historic Old Faithful Inn, built in 1903. The Inn is constructed almost entirely of local lodgepole pine and is one of the few log hotels in the world. Staying in this fabulous structure is almost worth the trip to Yellowstone in itself.

Day 9. Trekking across Grant's Pass

To make the most of Yellowstone, which is one of the greatest wilderness areas in North America, we need to get away from the crowds. So, it's time to strap on our packs and explore Yellowstone's picturesque backcountry. Our first day takes us over the continental divide by way of Grant's Pass to a camp located among Yellowstone's famed meadows and rolling hills. Elk and other wildlife are often spotted here.

Day 10. Trekking in Shoshone

Today we make a short hike to the pristine Shoshone backcountry and Geyser Basin. Unlike the area around Old Faithful's Upper Geyser Basin, there are no boardwalks or warning signs around these stunning geysers and hot springs. It's easy to imagine you're one of the first people to discover and enjoy these unique features.

Day 11. Trekking to Bechler Canyon

Heading off in the morning, we hike to the Three Rivers Junction at the head of spectacular Bechler Canyon. Near to our overnight camp, we can enjoy the pleasure of soaking in a hot spring near Bechler River, giving our muscles a well-deserved natural spa treatment.

Day 12. Trekking along the Bechler River

Our hike today takes us down through scenic Bechler Canyon, with volcanic ridges rising up on both sides. Waterfalls and roaring cascades greet us, as we hike down through the canyon. We'll make several easy, knee-deep fords across the Bechler River before arrive at our last campsite of the trip.

Day 13. Complete trek and return to Jackson

A final river crossing and then our route takes us through the extensive Bechler meadows and into an

impressive forest of lodgepole pines. We eventually reach the remote Bechler Ranger Station, where we meet up with our transport and drive back to Jackson. Overnight at our hotel.

Day 14. Transfer to Salt Lake City

We have an early start for the transfer back to Salt Lake City, where we check in to our overnight accommodation close to the airport.

Day 15. Depart from Salt Lake City

After a leisurely breakfast, we take the hotel's free shuttle bus back to our terminal and check in for the return flight to the UK.

Day 16. Arrive UK

Arrive London, Heathrow at breakfast time.

Important: This day-to-day schedule should be taken only as a general guide. Although we update our itineraries every year, to take into account such things as: changes to trekking routes and changes in the routing or availability of local transport, it is not possible to guarantee that any of our holidays will run exactly according to the proposed itinerary. A variety of factors, including adverse weather conditions and difficulties with transportation, can lead to enforced changes. The trip leader will make any changes that are necessary.

Trip Summary and Grading

16 days. (6 nights hotels and lodges, 8 nights camping, 10 days DEMANDING trekking). Max. altitude – 3353 metres (11,000 feet). An explanation of the trekking and climbing grades can be found on pages 6 & 7 of the KE 2006/07 brochure.

The two hikes that we make through the Tetons and in the Yellowstone National Park follow established routes and, for the most part, the paths are excellent. However, in looking for the most interesting viewpoints and during detours from the main route, we cross trackless areas. The average distance that we will cover on days when we are hiking between camps is, however, relatively high - at around 16 kilometres (10 miles) and the average daily walking times are around 6 hours. Unlike most KE treks, this is a backpacking trip and group members will be required to carry their personal equipment, plus a share of the group's equipment, food and fuel. We will be carrying a maximum of four days' supplies and on two trekking days will be making "out and back" ascents, which only require day sack provisions to be carried. When backpacking group members are likely to be carrying approximately 10kgs. of their own equipment and clothing, plus 5 to 7kgs. of communal equipment.

Trip Details

Joining arrangements and transfers

You should aim to meet at the group's hotel in Salt Lake City in the evening of Day 1 of the trip itinerary. On Day 2 you will transfer to Jackson where you will meet your local guide. You should use the courtesy phone in the arrivals hall to contact the hotel who provide a free shuttle bus. Full details of the joining arrangements, including hotel address and emergency

contact numbers are provided with your final confirmation letter. Alternatively if you are making your own travel arrangements, it is possible to join this trip at the group's hotel in Jackson in the early evening of Day 2 (Please note there is no further price reduction for joining/leaving the group in Jackson Hole). Again full details of the Jackson hotel are provided. Please inform the KE Office if Salt Lake City hotels and Jackson transfers are NOT required.

Services included

An experienced local leader. International flights (if booking a Land Only package plus flights), Salt Lake City Airport transfers (provided by group hotel), all land transport involved in the itinerary, hotel accommodation in Salt Lake City and in Jackson, lodge accommodation in Yellowstone. All meals, with the exception of breakfasts on Days 2, 3, 8, 9, and 14, lunches on Days 2, and 14 and dinners on Days 1, 2, 7, 8, 13 and 14. Whilst hiking, all food and equipment (excluding personal equipment) is included in the trip price.

Services not included

Travel insurance. Breakfasts on Days 2, 3, 8, 9, and 14. Lunches on Days 2, and 14. Dinners on Days 1, 2, 7, 8, 13 and 14. Tips for local staff, miscellaneous personal expenses – drinks, souvenirs etc..

Spending money

Whilst in hotel and lodge accommodation in Salt Lake City and in Jackson and whilst at the Old Faithful Lodge, group members will pay directly for their meals. This is a total of 5 breakfasts, 2 lunches and 6 evening meals to pay for. On average, breakfasts and lunches cost from \$4 to \$15 and dinners from \$10 to \$25. We estimate that a total of \$300 should be sufficient to cover your personal spending requirements including the above non-included meals, and should also cover bar bills, snacks etc. All park fees and fares are included in the trip price. If you are intending to buy expensive souvenirs, you should budget accordingly (credit cards can be useful in this respect. Your money can be carried in the form of cash (US Dollars) or travellers cheques.

Group leader and support staff

The group will be accompanied throughout the trip from Jackson to Jackson by one or two professional local guides (depending on group size).

Equipment

For this trip you will need the following: lightweight 4-season sleeping bag, lightweight camping mattress, walking boots, lightweight waterproof jacket and trousers, fleece jacket or similar, warm hat and gloves, an expedition rucksack of 70 – 80 litres capacity, a daypack of around 20 litres, head-torch and batteries, 2 x 1 litre water bottles, sunglasses, sun cream. A more detailed packing check list will be provided with your confirmation of booking. One of the main considerations when choosing equipment should be its weight, since this is a backpacking trip and you will be carrying all of your personal gear. KE provides lightweight two or three man tents, food and cooking equipment. Please also refer to the KE website www.keadventure.com for further information about appropriate equipment for our adventure holidays.

Baggage allowance on the trip

Since this is a backpacking trip you should make every effort to keep your baggage to a minimum. It is possible to leave travel clothes and any items not required on the trek at the group's hotel in Jackson.

Accommodation

During this trip the group will spend 2 nights in a hotel in Salt Lake City and 3 nights in a hotel in Jackson. The trip also includes 1 one night at the Old Faithful Lodge in Yellowstone National Park. There is a total of 8 nights camping. All accommodation is arranged on a twin sharing basis. If you are travelling by yourself you will be paired up with another single client. We cannot offer single tent occupancy as an option on this trip. Depending on availability, it may be possible to pre-book single rooms at the hotels in Salt Lake City and Jackson. Please contact the office for a quote.

KE Pricing and Flights

We are taking a new approach to trip pricing for 2006/07. With improved online booking technology, more frequent domestic connections and the proliferation of low-cost airlines, more of you are choosing to book your own international flights. On account of this, we have given priority to 'land only' prices in this dossier (please refer to the panel on the front page). The land only price does not include the cost of international flights and is based on joining the group in the destination country. Alongside the land only prices you will also see an estimated flight cost for each trip.

You can choose to book your holiday as a **Land Only Package plus Flights**, in which case KE will book your international airtickets, or as a **Land Only Package** and make your own international flight arrangements.

Land Only Package plus Flights

If you would like to book your flights through KE, you should indicate this on your booking form or contact the KE office to this effect. KE has full ATOL bonding and can book air tickets for any flight, from any airline, worldwide. For most of our holidays, we select a preferred flight and it is the estimated cost of airtickets for this flight that is shown in the pricing panel. (The estimated cost of this flight is based on fare information available at the time of printing). Up to date prices and flight timings for your chosen trip can be obtained by contacting the KE office.

Preferred flights

For those booking a Land Only Package plus Flights, we propose to use American Airlines for this trip. Flights depart from Terminal 3 of London's Heathrow airport in the early afternoon and travel via Chicago. The recommended check-in time is 3 hours before departure. The flight normally arrives in Salt Lake City mid evening the same day. The return flight normally departs Salt Lake City in the early afternoon and the connecting flight from Chicago arrives in the UK early the following morning. Less direct flight connections through other US cities are possible if there is no availability on the above routing. **Please note that all airline schedules are subject to change.** Full details of your flight schedule will be confirmed with your booking

If you would like to fly with an alternative airline, or if you want to extend your holiday by a few days, this can also be arranged within a Land Only Package plus Flights booking. Please contact the office to discuss your options.

UK add-on flights

Subject to availability, we can book add-on flights from 6 UK regional airports to connect with the group flights from London. These add-on flights are available from Aberdeen, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Newcastle, Manchester and Jersey into Heathrow. Booking these flights through the international carrier (American Airlines), allows us the flexibility to make reasonable changes to the booking without penalty and also means that you can book your baggage from your nearest airport all the way through to Salt Lake City. The cost of these flights is very reasonable starting from £40. We recommend that you do not purchase non-flexible add-on flights (or rail tickets), since the entire cost of such tickets will be lost in the case of your international flight being delayed.

Land Only Package

If you are making your own flight arrangements, you must check that your chosen holiday has reached the minimum numbers and is **'Guaranteed to Run'** - **BEFORE** paying for your airtickets. Check with the KE office or check the trip status on the KE website. Land only clients should book flights which enable them to meet their group either at the hotel in Salt Lake City on the evening of Day 1 of the trip itinerary, or at the group hotel in Jackson on the evening of Day 2. If you are returning from Salt Lake City, return flights should be booked to depart no sooner than the penultimate day (Day 15) of the trip itinerary.

WHETHER WE BOOK YOUR FLIGHTS OR YOU DO, EARLY BOOKING USUALLY MEANS CHEAPER AIRTICKETS.

General information

Climate

The temperatures that we can expect to encounter during the day will range from 18 to 27 degrees centigrade. At night the temperatures will typically drop to around 5 degrees centigrade. The weather is relatively stable at this time of year, but we can expect a few short (1-2 hours) afternoon or evening thundershowers and we cannot rule out the possibility of a couple of days of rain.

Visa requirements

No visas are currently required by British nationals for entry to North America unless you have a conviction or a police record. Please note that you **must** have a machine readable passport. A British passport is machine readable when there are two lines of letters, numbers and chevrons (">>>>") printed across the long edge of the personal information page (the page with photograph and personal details). You will not be allowed to travel if you do not have a machine readable passport. You may also be required to provide details of your first night's accommodation in the USA. This information will form part of your final payment receipt letter which is sent to you 6 weeks prior to departure. Please ensure that you have this letter with you when you check in for your flight.

Vaccinations

You should attend your own GP and dentist for a check-up. Your GP will have access to the most up to date information on the required vaccinations for the country you are visiting. In general we do not require that you have any vaccinations for this trip other than standard travel jabs (Polio, Tetanus, and Hepatitis A).

First Aid

A medical kit will accompany each trek. The guides on this trip will have appropriate wilderness first-aid training and are experienced in dealing with a range of medical problems associated with adventure travel. We recommend that you bring your own personal first aid kit consisting of the following: A broad spectrum antibiotic, antiseptic cream, throat lozenges, diarrhoea treatment (Imodium) painkillers, plasters and blister treatment, Insect repellent (DEET), and re-hydration salts (Dioralite). Glucose tablets or Kendal Mint cake, and multi-vitamin tablets are a good idea.
